2. VOICINGS


Choral music is written in a wide variety of voicings: SATB, SAB, SSA, TTBB, etc.

3. DESIGN

There are two basic designs for a choral score:

- A. Each part is written on a separate line.
- B. Two or more voices per line.





4. WORTH KNOWING

A Cappella is a Latin expression meaning "sung without instrumental accompaniment"; in other words, "voices only."
